



Why Leadership Sandpoint?

Sandpoint and the surrounding communities are dynamic. The energy and constant reshaping presents many challenges and opportunities for the local citizenry. Keeping our communities vibrant and healthy requires visionary and thoughtful leaders who have the ability to communicate, be strategic and work effectively with a wide variety of groups. LEADERSHIP SANDPOINT is designed to facilitate the development and growth of the leaders of tomorrow and provide an opportunity to interact with diverse community members as the class explores the various roles of leadership and involvement in our communities.

GOALS OF LEADERSHIP SANDPOINT:

To identify and motivate current leaders.

To acquaint these identified leaders with community needs and opportunities.

To give leaders an opportunity to meet past and present leaders, and be motivated toward greater involvement.

To further facilitate community involvement a nine hour course in Board Training is included.

SELECTION AND TUITION

- **Applications**—Anyone interested in community affairs and learning more about the Sandpoint area is invited to apply.
APPLICATION DEADLINE: August 20, 2018.
- **Selection**—Candidates will be selected with a view toward establishing a diverse mix of ages, professions, activities and outlooks as evidenced on the applications. Class size is limited to 20!
- **Deposit**—A **\$25.00 deposit must accompany all applications.** This deposit will be applied towards the tuition for successful applicants. Those not selected will receive a full refund of their deposit. The deposit will **NOT** be refunded after notification to successful applicants on or before August 31, 2018.
- **Tuition**—\$350.00 for Chamber Members, \$400 for non-members.
- Your tuition fee is payable upon notification of selection. Tuition covers the costs of the class sessions, meals, materials and group transportation. **Tuition must be paid in full by September 12, 2018 and is nonrefundable.**
- **Attendance**—Leadership Sandpoint consists of nine sessions the first year, and planning and facilitating sessions for the second year. Participants are expected to attend all sessions and **must not miss more than two sessions in order to graduate.** It is vital for both the individual and the class each member be present to add his their perspective. Graduation occurs at the end of year two.
- **Commitment**— **Leadership Sandpoint is a two-year commitment.** In addition to participating in their own class, graduates are responsible for organizing and facilitating the following year's class sessions. Plans are laid out for facilitators making it an easy process.

One session per month, generally 8:00am—4:00pm (locations vary)

PROGRAM SCHEDULE

Leadership Sandpoint consists of 9 all-day sessions that occur on the 3rd Wednesday of each month starting in September. In year two, as a facilitator, you are expected to participate in a planning session to get a jump start on the next year's classes.

2018

Leadership Skills & Teambuilding—September 19, 2018 Using team building exercises and activities; develop motivation, create a 'team' atmosphere, become acquainted with classmates. Learn how to increase effective co-operation in the group. Remember great teamwork makes things happen more than anything else in organizations.

The Cornerstones of Sandpoint—October 17, 2018 This session begins at the Bonner County Historical Museum and will provide an overview of the geological and political history of the region and the important part the Timber and Rail industries have played in our economy.

Education & the Arts—November 14, 2018 We will focus on the diversity of educational opportunities and the lifelong pursuit of learning in our community, explore the arts in our eclectic community.

Human & Community Services—December 19, 2018 Explore the variety of human services available in Bonner County and the challenges faced by service providers in meeting basic needs.

2019

Sustainability—January 16, 2019 Exploring our local sustainable businesses, community garden and other programs will help you discover the diverse efforts our community has put in place as sustainability efforts. This class will explore "buy local" programs, community gardens and eco-friendly businesses.

Law Enforcement, Judicial System, Local & State Government—Feb 20, 2019 Representatives of local police and sheriff departments, as well as the local judiciary, will provide an overview of our law enforcement and the courts. Take part in an exchange with a variety of elected officials and discuss issues concerning their leadership and influence in our community. Learn about opportunities for your future leadership roles.

Economic Drivers—March 20, 2019 The group will focus on an overview of our local economy including; demographics, economic development, organizations and manufacturing.

Health & Wellness—April 17, 2019 Focus will be on individual health and well-being. Discover the variety and the role of traditional and integrative health services in our community.

Natural Resources & Tourism—May 15, 2019 Our quality of life is greatly influenced by our abundant natural resources. You will explore their roles in our past and future in maintaining our desired quality of life. You will also learn how tourism is managed for our region and state.

Planning Session for Next Year's Program—Date TBD The current Leadership Class will meet with the Chamber President/CEO to review the year's program and work together to plan the next year's sessions.
